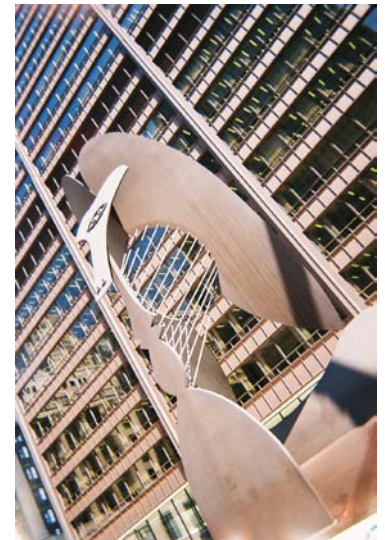


Art & About

When “The Picasso” was unveiled in 1967, it was the first large scale piece of public art in downtown Chicago. Since then, the city has become well-known for hosting unique and beautiful works of art in its parks, plazas and streets. Stroll through the Loop to get up close and personal with works from Picasso, Chagall, Calder and others on your own self-guided Art & About walking tour. Once you’ve taken in the big names, get a sneak peak at future greats with a special tour of the School of the Art Institute’s Sullivan Galleries or Betty Rymer Gallery. Talk to students at this world-renowned school about careers in the art world and how to get there. Stay overnight with your troop at Hostelling International Chicago and dream up your next creation.
